

**ECONOMIC INDICATORS OF THE REGIONS OF UZBEKISTAN DURING THE
PANDEMIC**

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ABSTRACT

This paper makes analyses of the Economic indicators of the regions of Uzbekistan during the pandemic. On this case, research and theoretical basis were analyzed as the whole.

INTRODUCTION

In 2020-th year, the economy of almost all countries in the world was seriously affected by the coronavirus pandemic. The pandemic negatively affected the development of the economy of Uzbekistan, but due to the measures taken by the government to support it in a timely manner, the economy of Uzbekistan suffered much less when most countries of the world entered the economy. The positive growth rate was maintained, but decreased from 5.6% in 2019 to 1.6% in 2020, but reached 3.0% growth rate in the first quarter of 2021.

According to the results of 2019, the city of Tashkent has the largest share of 15.4% in the formation of the National Anthem, The Tashkent region occupies the next level with the indicators of 10.5% and Samarkand region of 7.3%, Navoi region of 7.1%. The minimum share in the formation of the National Anthem corresponds to Syrdarya (2.2%), Jizzakh (3.0), Khorezm regions (3.6%), The Republic of Karakalpakstan (3.7%).

In 2020, the city of Tashkent made the biggest contribution with a share of 15.3%. Tashkent region occupies the next place with an indicator of 10.8% and Navoi region with an indicator of 8.4%. Here, the Sammarkand and Navoi regions had a slowdown and growth rate, especially the Navoi region had a growth rate of 1.3%. The minimum share in the formation of the National Anthem corresponds to the regions of Sirdarya (2.1%), Jizzakh (3.0%), Khorezm (3.6%) and the Republic of Karakalpakstan (3.7%). The Syrdarya region has a growth rate, while the Republic of Jizzakh, Khorezm and Karakalpakstan have maintained their indicators for the past year.

In January - March 2021, the city of Tashkent made the biggest contribution to the formation of the National Anthem by 18.4%. Tashkent region occupies the next place with 11.3% and Navoi region with 9.1%. The minimum share in the formation of the Republic of Naim is in the regions of Sirdarya (2.0 %) and Jizzakh (2.6%).

According to the State Statistics Office, in January - March 2021, the volume of gross domestic product of the Republic of Uzbekistan amounted to 128 556.8 billion at current prices. made up the sum. Compared with the corresponding period of 2020 - th year, the growth rate is 103,0%.

Gross domestic product (GDP) grew by 3% in the first three months of the year 2021, production growth in all sectors of the economy was observed. (For comparison: in early April, Bloomberg reported that economic experts expect the world economy to grow by only 1,3% in the first quarter). In 2019, it accounted for 5,8%, in 2020-1.6%, with a high growth rate in the first quarter of 2021 compared to the previous year.

The network of Agriculture, Forestry and fisheries for the growth of YaIM 0,4 f.p. (In January-March 2020-0,5 f.p.), industrial network-1,2 f.p. (In January-March 2020-0,6 f.p.) and service network 1,1 f.p. (In January-March 2020-2,5 f.p.) contributed positively. Although the volume of construction work grew by 2020

by 0,5% compared to January - March of the year 2020, this practically did not affect the growth of the ICO (in January-March of the year 2020 - 0,5 f.p.). On account of the increase in net taxes on products, YaIM 0,3 f.p. (In January-March 2020-0,5 f.p.) ga increased.

By the end of 2019, the network of Agriculture, Forestry and fisheries for the growth of YaIM 0.9 f.p. industrial network-1.2 f.p. and the construction network is 1.2 f.p. contributed positively. The added value of the service sector grew by 2.2% compared to the previous year. Nevertheless, this area almost did not affect the growth of YaIM. On account of the increase in net taxes on products, YaIM 0.5 f.p. ga increased.

In 2019, the highest share of Agriculture, Forestry and fisheries in GDP was observed in Jizzakh region (56,8%), the highest share of industry in Navoi region (66,8%), the highest share of construction and services sector in Tashkent City (respectively, 10,2% and 53,3%). The minimum share of Agriculture, Forestry and fisheries in the GDP was recorded in the Navoi region (16.7 %), the minimum share of industry in the Surkhondarya region (7.9 %), and the minimum share of construction and services in the Navoi region (respectively, 4,5% and 12.0%).

In 2020, the highest share of Agriculture, Forestry and fisheries in the GDP was observed in Jizzakh (56.1 %) and Surkhondarya (50.4 %) regions, the highest share of industry in Navoi (71.2 %) and Tashkent (48.4 %) regions, the highest share of construction was observed in Tashkent (10.2 %) and Surkhondarya region (8.8%), the highest share of services sector was observed in Tashkent (51.5 %) and

In January - March 2021, the highest share of Agriculture, Forestry and fisheries in the GDP was recorded in the regions of Jizzakh (39.9%) and Khorezm (34.7%), the highest share of industry in the regions of Navoi (76.7%) and Tashkent (52.7%), the highest share of construction in the regions of Surkhondarya (11.1%) and Bukhara region (10.1%), the highest share of services) observed.

In January-March 2021, Kashkadarya region (110.0 %), Tashkent City High growth rates were recorded in the regions (109.3 %), Sirdarya (107.4 %) and Navoi (107.3%). In Andijan region, a decrease in GDP was recorded, which amounted to 94,6 per cent compared to January - March of 2020. In the Buxoro region, GDP remained at the level of the corresponding period last year (100,0%). Relatively low growth rates of GDP to the Republican level (103,0 %) were observed in the Namangan (102,3 %) and Fergana (101,5 %) regions. In January - March 2021, the city of Tashkent made the biggest contribution to the formation of the National Anthem by 18.4%. Tashkent region occupies the next place with an indicator of 1 1.3% and Navoi region 9.1%. The minimum share in the formation of the Republic of Naim corresponds to the regions of Sirdarya (2.0 %) and Jizzakh (2.6%).
